### New Jersey State Board of Education Announces Plans for State System of Assessments

At their September 2019 meeting, the New Jersey State Board of Education announced its plans regarding the state assessments:

Administration of the New Jersey Student Learning Assessments will continue until at least 2021. The intent is to eliminate this assessment and replace it with a new assessment by the 2022-2023 school year.

A planned elimination of 10th grade tests. Beginning in 2020-2021, annual testing will occur only in grades 3 through 9 and 11. The 11th grade "exit test" remains as per state law

This fall the New Jersey Department of Education will issue requests for proposals for the next generation of assessments.

During the 2021-2022 academic year, there will be a field test of the next generation of assessments in grades 3 to 9 and an administration of the 11th grade graduation assessment (by court order, the NJDOE is required to administer an 11th grade graduation assessment for the class of 2023 and beyond).

The full implementation of the next generation of assessments will occur in the 2022-2023 school year.


